Understanding

The purpose of writing and editing the content for Big Law Firm is to let the company's personality show. While the subject of patent and copyright law may be underwhelming, Big Law Firm is not. The new and refreshed content will reflect the uniqueness of the firm, and the depth of your knowledge of your work, thus setting you apart from your competitors.

Process

1) Research

• Reading through existing materials and will include an interview with Dan and/or another member of the team.

2) Writing

- <u>Pre-pages</u>: Before digging in too deep, I'll write a few web pages to make sure we're capturing the brand voice, key messaging, and working well with the design.
- <u>Digging in</u>: Once I've received feedback and made changes, I'll write a few pages at a time and send to Dan for review as the batches are completed.

3) Review

- <u>Edits</u>: Once I receive the edited pages, I'll revise as you continue to review new batches. It should be a seamless rotation.
- <u>Timeline</u>: Ideally, once we're in the rotation, each section would take no more than a few days to complete. This is what it will look like:

Write \rightarrow Review \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow Review \rightarrow Final Edit
